FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR:

The Real Joseph Smith

I pray that members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints would do an honest search of the actual history of their founder, Joseph Smith Jr. If they were to do that, they would find things that would cause them to see that he was not a man of God.

Joseph Fielding Smith, the 10th President of the LDS church said,

"Mormonism as it is called, must stand or fall on the story of Joseph Smith. He was either a Prophet of God, divinely called, properly appointed and commissioned, or he was one of the biggest frauds this world has ever seen. There is no middle ground."

"If Joseph Smith was a deceiver, who willfully attempted to mislead the people then he should be exposed; his claims should be refuted, and his doctrines shown to be false, for the doctrines of an imposter cannot be made to harmonize in all particulars with divine truth. If his claims and declarations were built upon fraud and deceit, there would appear many errors and contradictions, which would be easy to detect. The doctrines of false teachers will not stand the test when tried by

the accepted standards of measurement, the scriptures." (Doctrines of Salvation by Joseph Fielding Smith, Vol.1, pg 188).

We have accepted this challenge and ask the Mormons to do the same. Consider the following:

- *False Prophecies of Joseph Smith*, a book in our bookstore that details at least 56 false prophecies he gave that never came true. According to the Bible (Deut.18:20-22), we see that it would only take one false prophesy to make a false prophet.
- He was married to at least 40 women, some as young as 14 or 15 and at least 11 who were currently married to other men. He said men had to have at least 2 wives or they couldn't go to their Celestial heaven. (Doctrine & Covenants 132:5) God said otherwise in I Tim.3:2, 12.
- He was arrested and convicted for using a seer stone to allegedly find buried treasures for people; none were found. He later used this stone to supposedly translate from golden plates, which he described as characters written in "reformed Egyptian," into the *Book of Mormon*. He also wrote the Book of Abraham in the *Pearl of Great Price* using the same method. All

this was later proven false once it was widely known how to translate the Egyptian language.

- He started a bank which went bankrupt, losing thousands of dollars of the many Mormons who supported him. No one knows what he did with the money he lost.
- He had himself anointed king and desired to be general of his army. He also ran for president of the U.S. Was all this to eventually rule over the world?
- After he finished *The Book of Mormon* in 1830 he declared it was the most correct book on earth. Yet since then there have been almost 4,000 changes or errors found in it. *The Doctrine & Covenants* has been changed almost 2,800 times to correct "errors" made in it after its completion in 1835. And finally, the *Pearl of Great Price*, which contains the section called The Book of Abraham. Joseph Smith allegedly translated 56 characters he declared were the writings of Abraham. However, when the Rosetta Stone was discovered, the world was able to read Egyptian. According to Joseph Smith these 56 characters translated into over 4,000 words, yet none of them had anything to do with Abraham. Instead it was found to be a

common pagan burial document placed with the deceased, which ancient Egyptians called the Book of Breathing. This was to get them from this life to the next because they believed in reincarnation.

- The worst thing Joseph Smith did was to rewrite the Bible. When you point out to a Mormon that Smith did this and quote Revelations 22:18-19 to them about adding to or taking away anything in the Bible, their response is usually that Revelations is only talking about the book of Revelations. I'm able then to show them that Smith also rewrote Revelations in his "Inspired Version," and thus was condemned. They have no response to that.

It's obvious by the historical documentation uncovered in the years since Joseph Smith claimed he was called of God to be a prophet, that instead "he was a deceiver." As Joseph Fielding Smith said, if he "willfully attempted to mislead the people then he should be exposed-----." Joseph Smith has been exposed! Our prayer is for open eyes and hearts of the Mormon people, that they may be led into the loving arms of the Jesus Christ of the Bible.

The following is an excerpt from Pothole #5:

As evening closed in, dark clouds loomed on the horizon. Waves lifted the bow of the ship high up into the graying skies and the wind spit cold salt spray into our faces. The ship began to pitch and roll fiercely. *Relax, I've got to relax.* My stomach quivered despite deep breathing. *Remember natural childbirth relaxation exercises. It worked then.* But I couldn't focus. The heaving sea threatened my very being.

David hit the rails. "Well, I got rid of my cookies first. You guys are all next, so don't laugh." We didn't. In fact, none of us laughed. Everyone had nervous smiles, our white knuckles gripped whatever we could find.

"This is not good. Maybe Captain Ned will turn around," I suggested.

"I wish," Trish said between chattering teeth. "The captain doesn't even consider turning around unless there is a tropical storm. This is just an ordinary squall, all sailors expect them."

"Problem is, I'm not a sailor, never have been and I believe I never want to be," I retorted.

Trish went below—it was too cold topside. I followed. Sweats beneath my raingear would feel good. I clung to each vertical wooden rung down into the captain's salon. The ship rocked from side to side and the moment I reached the bottom and turned around, the cabin seemed to spin wildly. Charts slid from the captain's table and the smell of vomit reached my nostrils. I gagged. Each crew member had his own bowl to be sick in. I dropped to my knees and crawled on hands and knees to the "head."

I can make it. I can make it. Just get my sweats on and get back up topside, quick. No such luck. I grabbed my sweats and had them about halfway on when the smell got to me and I heaved too. Yuk.

The ship bucked wildly as I crawled back up, clinging tightly to each wooden rung. I had to get away from the gagging smell and sound of retching below. The first waft of fresh salt air cleared my nostrils but pelted and stung my face relentlessly.

Jim was in the cockpit white-knuckling the steering wheel. I'd never seen him so pale.

Suddenly, "Move over!" Jim scrambled to the rail, thrust

Suddenly the men on deck yelled, "Look out!"



DOES CHARACTER COUNT?

Brigham Young, an Apostle of Joseph Smith while Joseph lived, and the Prophet of the Mormon church (1847-1877) 3 years after the Latter-day Saints' arrival in the Salt Lake Valley, said the following in the LDS church publication, *Journal of Discourses*, Vol. 4, p. 78:

"I recollect a conversation I had with a priest who was an old friend of ours, before I was personally acquainted with the Prophet Joseph. I clipped every argument he advanced, until at last he came out and began to rail against "Joe Smith," saying, "that he was a mean man, a liar, money-digger, gambler, and a whore-master;" and he charged him with everything bad, that he could find language to utter. I said, hold on, brother Gillmore, here is the doctrine, here is the Bible, the Book of Mormon, and the revelations that have come through Joseph Smith the Prophet. I have never seen him, and do not know his private character. The doctrine he teaches is all I know about the matter, bring anything against that if you can. As to anything else I do not care. If he acts like a devil, he has brought forth a doctrine that will save us, if we will abide it. He may get drunk every day of his life, sleep with his neighbor's wife every night, run horses and gamble, I do not care anything about that, for I never embrace any man in my faith. But the doctrine he has produced will save you and me, and the whole world; and if you can find fault with that, find it. He said, 'I have done.' "

In coming to Joseph Smith's defense, against the accusations of a priest, Brigham Young made a startling declaration. If the "Prophet" Joseph Smith had lived a lifestyle of drunkenness, adultery and other vices, he said, "I do not care anything about that." What did Brigham Young say he did care about? "But the doctrine he has produced will save you and me, and the whole world; and if you can find fault with that, find it."

In Jesus' Own Words

What did Jesus say about the character of a man who would be a prophet, in Matthew 7:15-20?

"15 Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. 16 Ye shall know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? 17 Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree bringeth forth evil fruit. 18 A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit. 19 Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire. 20 Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them." (KJV)

Jesus used a simple horticultural principle, to ensure that we not be fooled by false prophets. A good tree brings forth good fruit, because it cannot bring forth evil fruit. Likewise, a corrupt tree will only bring forth evil fruit, because it cannot bring forth

good fruit. Jesus' conclusion to this lesson is that we will know false prophets by their fruits.

It's Not About Joseph

For the record, I want to clearly state that Joseph Smith's actual character is not at issue in this article. Though there is much documentation from early Mormon church history, to be convinced that Joseph Smith was a man of bad character, he was not known to "get drunk every day of his life, sleep with his neighbor's wife every night, run horses and gamble."


It's All About Brigham

But, could a prophet "get drunk every day of his life, sleep with his neighbor's wife every night, run horses and gamble," and still be considered a good tree? Not hardly. So, then, could such a lifestyle result in the producing of good fruit, especially in the form of good doctrine, as Brigham Young believed? Obviously, not.

Being a follower of Jesus Christ implies learning, understanding and following His teachings. If Brigham Young *had* understood and followed Christ's teaching in Matthew 7:15-20, he could not have held the view that a prophet's doctrine has no connection to his character. What Brigham Young thought he so cleverly replied to the priest, to rebuff the priest's character objections, exposed Young's lack of understanding of, or disregard for Christ's clear teaching that a bad tree (someone of bad character) cannot bear good fruit (a doctrine that will save us all). Instead, Brigham's comments to the entire Mormon membership of his generation, and each succeeding generation, misled them to believe that character doesn't count.

What a remarkable example of how just one man's disregard of just one of Christ's teachings, can affect the lives of untold millions.

Conversely, as so many have come to disregard Joseph Smith's and Brigham Young's teachings, and to embrace the teachings of Christ, the population of ex-Mormons in the kingdom of God grows.



ASK ANDY

[In this new column we will address some of the questions we receive most often.]

Question: I am a Christian who is dating a Mormon. I realize our religions are different and yet now I've become emotionally involved. He is the most wonderful person I've ever known. However, I'm concerned for his salvation. What do I do now?

Dear _____,

I am so happy to hear of your desire to witness to your friend. You have a unique opportunity to share the hope you have because of your relationship with Jesus. The most important thing you can do is share this hope with your friend.

My own experience in Mormonism taught me that there is no hope offered in the "Mormon gospel." I was always trying to win the approval of God by keeping the commandments. I was taught that I needed to do this in order to be forgiven and to live with my Father in heaven. I struggled with this so much because no matter how hard I tried, I always broke the commandments. I knew as a Mormon that the Holy Ghost would leave me (according to Mormon doctrine) every time I did this. I wondered what was wrong with me. I was afraid to die, because I did not know if I was good enough to make it to the celestial kingdom.

After I became a true follower of Christ, I realized it was not about what I did that allowed me to go to heaven with God the Father but I was allowed into heaven because of the righteousness of Jesus He credited to me. Finally I understood my sin was washed away and I had a new hope that could not be taken away. It is this hope that I never had as a Mormon, but was looking for everywhere.

Showing your friend the assurance you have for the future in heaven will hopefully make him desire to have that same hope. In order to witness to your friend you will need to study.

There are several resources we have at Concerned Christians to help you in witnessing. I really like the *Mormon Scrapbook*. It shows you how to use the Bible and the *Book of Mormon* to show the errors of Mormonism. There are many times that the *Book of Mormon* disagrees with Mormon doctrine and at the same time agrees with the Bible. It will show you how to start the conversation and how to know the thinking of a Mormon.

It's also important to share with Mormons some history of how the Bible was put together. I was taught as a Mormon that you could not rely on the Bible, that many things were lost in the translation. As I came out of Mormonism and started studying the Bible I found this was completely false. Ask your friend questions like, "Did you know that the New Testament books have over 25,000 manuscripts that demonstrate it's authenticity and that date from 70-350 A.D.?" This will help you show the evidence we have for the New Testament. Some good resources that can help you are; *New Evidence that Demands a Verdict* by Josh McDowell and *God's Word Final, Infallible and Forever*. We carry the latter here at Concerned Christians.

If you can show your friend that we really do have the writings of Paul [and others] in the Bible today, and that Paul disagrees with Joseph, then your friend has a very important decision to make. "Do I follow Joseph or the prophets of the Bible?"

Another resource we have is *Witness to Mormons*. This will help in other important issues like the Mormon definition of words. There are many times when we talk about a Christian topic but to a Mormon it has a different meaning. It is almost like learning another language. *Witness to Mormons* also gives references to Mormon publications that disagree with the Bible. If you would like more information on other resources we have, please go to our web site at www.concernedchristians.org.

The decision to stay in Mormonism or leave is up to your friend. If however he decides to stay, then you have an important decision to make. I do not want to tell you what you should do, but I do wish to go over the consequences of your decision. Let me ask you a question. If you were to get married, and later have kids, what belief will your kids have, your belief or his? What if his family was to ask your friend, do you want to live with your family forever? And because of the love your friend has for his kids, desires to go through the temple. Would you be able to say no? The decision is yours to make. Make it a decision that later you won't regret.
