

It's ironic that the Mormons are angry that someone is going door-to-door telling the Mormons that their religion is false. (Anti-Mormon DVD given to 18,000 homes, March 27) Isn't that what the 50,000 full-time Mormon missionaries are doing, every day of every year? The Mormons are telling anyone who will listen that their present religion (even if it's a kind of Christianity) is false, and that they must be baptized by a Mormon elder in order to be saved. Joseph Smith, the first Mormon, was the first to attack other religions, claiming that God had told him that all religions of his day were an "abomination" in his (God's) sight. ## Around the World

"Give thanks to the LORD, call on his name; make known among the nations what he has done, and proclaim that his name is exalted. Sing to the LORD, for he has done glorious things; let this be known to all the world..." (Isaiah 12:5-6). We watch in awe and amazement as it seems that God is allowing us the privilege of becoming involved in proclaiming His name be known around the world.

While many are aware of the recent Jesus Christ/ Joseph Smith DVD distribution, few are aware of what has been quietly happening behind the scenes for the past several months here at Concerned Christians. In early February, we received an e-mail from Nicholas in Uganda, East Africa. He requested information and resources to help equip the four members of a small apologetics ministry that is reaching out to Christians who are being deceived by cults such as Mormonism. This is the only ministry like it in Uganda. We sent Nicholas a variety of books including some published by Christians and some published by the LDS church in order to show their true teachings. In addition, Andy is helping develop a basic and advanced curriculum that will be used and taught at a training academy for pastors in Uganda.

In mid February, we received another e-mail requesting resources, this one came from Mark & Loreto in Arica, Chile. Books published by the LDS church are very difficult to locate in Chile and are very expensive, thus they wrote to us. Because of some generous donations in the past, we were able to send LDS published books in both English and Spanish, thus providing this couple and their church with excellent educational and witnessing tools.

We've also been communicating with Malachi in Hyderabad, India for a couple of years and were amazed to hear recently that the LDS church is advertising on ambulances throughout Hyderabad. Although we've sent resources

through the years, in February were able to send some small booklets and several copies of the *Jesus Christ/Joseph Smith* DVD. With these, they will teach local pastors about the deceptiveness of Mormonism.

Finally, Andy received an e-mail this past week from a man in Yangan, Myanmar (formerly Burma) who was requesting help leaving the LDS church. Although we are unable to give further details in order to protect this mans identity, we are e-mailing back and forth and are waiting to hear which people group and language group he is from. Since Myanmar is technically considered Unreached,\* we are unsure how much (if any) of the Bible has been published in his language but pray that God will provide the materials he needs in order to hear and understand the Truth.

We pray that God will powerfully use these people from around the world to further spread His Truth to those who are lost. What an amazing God we serve!

\* "An unreached people group is a people group (a distinct group of people that is united by a common language, culture, region, religion) in which there is no indigenous community of believing Christians able to evangelize their own people. Over 10,000 such groups exist, many of them without a single book of the Bible in their native language" (*Worldwide Perspectives*, edited by Meg Crossman, Chapter 6, pp. 159-172).

## Movie Preview: SEPTEMBER DAWN (Rated: R for violence)

### The Mountain Meadows Massacre

On 9/11, 1857, the tragedy known as the Mountain Meadows Massacre, became a part of American history. This year marks the sesquicentennial (150th) anniversary. This massacre of Americans by Americans was surpassed only by the Oklahoma bombing in 1995.

Wagon Masters John T. Baker and Captain Alexander Fancher, led a wagon train of over 120 Arkansas emigrants through an area of southern Utah Territory called Mountain Meadows, en route to California. They never made it. When the wagon train stopped in Mountain Meadows in early September, 1857, they are first met by Mormon deacon John D. Lee and his friends. Urged by Lee to leave the encampment, Capt. Fancher stood fast and pleaded for compassion, as his teams needed to refresh and rest. But, to no avail.

Over a period of several days, they were attacked either by Paiute Indians, a mix of Paiutes and Mormons, or Mormons dressed as Paiutes. Then, after being deceived by a flag of truce, the men, women, and children were brutally slaughtered.

Children under 10 were spared, and adopted by Mormon families, until federal forces returned them to Eastern relatives.

### Made Into a Movie

On June 22, 2007, a film called September Dawn by director/producer Christopher Cain and Carole Whang Schutter, and starring Jon Voight as a fictitious Mormon Bishop named Jacob Samuelson, will open in theaters around the country. This movie will hopefully highlight the truth of what really happened in the valley of Mountain Meadows.

Christopher Cain's other movie productions include, "The Principal," "Young Guns," "The Next Karate Kid" and "Gone Fishin'."

Movie actors/newcomers, Trent Ford and Tamara Hope, play a frontier Romeo and Juliet. One a member of the wagon train, the other a member of the Mormon church, in a fictional romance played out against the drama of the historically real massacre. Terence Stamp plays the part of the steely Brigham Young, who is heard in voice-over, encouraging vengeance, violence, "blood

atonement" and divine justice.

### Who Done It

The Provo Herald reported that the 1857 massacre was perpetrated "by the Iron County Mormon militia and a band of Indians at the meadow,..." (Daily Herald, Provo, Utah, December 29, 1996, p. A-1). The only one of fifty-eight Mormons who was prosecuted, found guilty and executed by firing squad on March 23, 1877, was John D. Lee.

"But the entire massacre itself," said Christopher Cain, "and the stuff with the Indians leading up to it, is taken from John D. Lee's confession, which was 25 to 27 pages long." Lee was a high-ranking lieutenant of Brigham Young's militia, otherwise known in LDS history as the Danites.

Besides being the President and Prophet of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, from December of 1847 until his death on August 29, 1877, Brigham Young was also the Governor of Utah Territory throughout most of his tenure as the Mormon Church leader. Controversy surrounds the question of whether Brigham Young had prior knowledge of the impending Mormon raid on the wagon train, or if he actually ordered the attack. John D. Lee asserted that Young ordered the attack.

As reported in the New York Times, "Michael Purdy, a representative of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints disputed historical claims that Young ordered the killings in a drive to keep non-Mormons out of Utah." But, I have to wonder, how the Mormon militia could perpetrate such a horrific slaughter of so many innocent people, without the knowledge or consent of the one who was in charge of the territory, the church, and the church militia. Would almost sixty men, who believed themselves to be Christians, really act independently, without unmistakable orders from their Commander, Brigham Young?

Mr. Cain said further, in his interview with the New York Times, "And by the way, I didn't write any of his dialogue," explaining that it was all in the depositions that Young gave after the massacre. "I sat here watching this a couple of weeks ago and I was thinking: 'Maybe I made that up. I don't think he would have said that.' And I went back and pulled it up and, man, he did."
