


CHANGING OF THE GUARD

Thirty-Seven years ago, after having left the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, my wife Judy and I, along with a handful of others started Concerned Christians. At that time our desire was to reach out to the Mormons with the real Jesus Christ. That hasn't changed. However we came to realize that our primary goal was to educate the Christian community about the deception of Mormonism. Word got out that there was a couple who wanted to not only educate people about the deception, but to share what our research had uncovered about how Joseph Smith succeeded in deceiving the people. Those deceived were guilty of the same thing we were and that was to believe in the Bible, but not know what it said. That is not the case today because we know God's word very well.

For several years we held support groups in our home until we out-grew it and began meeting in churches, bookstores and other homes. We also had a heavy schedule of teaching in churches, counseling Mormons and teaching others how to witness.

At the request of the King of Tonga, Judy and I were asked to come help his people understand why Mormonism was not from God. We had the same experience in the Samoan Islands. After staying there for seven years, we were forced to move back to the states because I had become seriously diabetic and you don't want to trust the bush doctors for that. When we went to the South Pacific, we left the ministry in the hands of our board and when we returned they asked me to resume as the Executive Director.

The ministry has steadily grown and finally we recognized a need to have our own facilities. We found a perfect location right behind the Mesa Mormon Temple where we have been for several years. During these past many years we have had the privilege of seeing many come to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior. I've also seen the diabetes take its toll on me and have been encouraged by the doctors to slow way down. At the young age of 73, I decided it was time.

This is not easy to do, but I know I need to if I want to enjoy my grandkids while I still can. Judy and I now have a little home up in Pine, Arizona. We will always look forward to our friends coming up to visit and enjoy the snow in the winter and the cool days in the summer.

One of the many we have seen come to the Lord through this ministry, has been chosen to replace me. He has been teaching for us now for about three years and may have even been to your church or may have counseled you or a family member. We are very pleased to have Andy Poland as the General Manager of Concerned Christians and he will begin his job on January 5, 2009. His profile is on page two, and you will see that he is well qualified for this position. I will remain as the Chairman of the Board and will occasionally teach when needed, especially out of town or out of state or country.

I want to thank all of you who have supported us in prayer, physically and financially over these last 37 years and I pray that you will continue to do so as the ministry is always in need of prayer and your gracious financial gifts. May God bless you all as He has blessed Judy and me.

From Andy...

The New Year brings a new era of change within Concerned Christians. Jim Robertson has decided to retire and has asked me to join Concerned Christians as the new General Manager. I enjoy the chance to tell others about the differences between Mormonism and Biblical Christianity. My background gives me a unique viewpoint into the Mormon world. I was born and raised a Mormon, served a faithful LDS Mission, was sealed (married) in the Mesa Temple to my wife Lori and I am a convert to Christianity of six years.

My wife and I both left Mormonism together with our five children. Since that time I have sought opportunities to talk with Mormons and Christians alike to explain the differences between my current relationship with Jesus and my former faith.

Legacy

To me, the legacy of Jim Robertson will always be how he helped my family and me to come out of Mormonism and embrace faith in Jesus. I met Jim and Judy Robertson at a senior's conference at Central Christian Church. Jim was teaching at this conference about his experience with Mormonism and explaining the differences between Mormonism and Christianity. Later I had an opportunity to talk to Jim and Judy. At that time in my life, I was considering whether Christianity had anything to offer. I was surprised that Jim and Judy's demeanor was so different than what I had been taught as a Mormon. I expected to find these "Anti-Mormons" lecturing me about the evils of Mormonism and telling me how bad it is to be a part of the Mormon religion. I was surprised when Jim and Judy began talking to me about my relationship to Jesus and the difficulties of leaving Mormonism.

Furthermore, Jim invited me to Concerned Christians for a Mormon support group meeting that week.

That Thursday night changed my relationship with Christ in a way that I never expected. I explained to the Christians who were in

attendance, that I was leaving Mormonism and that I was in the process of getting "saved." I knew that there must be a number of things that I must do to qualify for Christ's grace. The well-trained Christians present began to open up the Bible and read verse after verse explaining that salvation was not something I did for Christ it was something that Christ did for me. I remember as they read the words from 1 John 5:11-13. "I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life." These words hit me with power because I knew that I believed in the son of God and therefore I had eternal life right now. My faith was no longer in my works presented to Christ for his reward, but a simple belief that Christ had saved me already by believing in him. That was not the end of the miracles that night, because they prayed that my wife would be there the next week. I did not believe this was possible but the next week she was there at Concerned Christians.

As I became more involved with Concerned Christians, Jim has always been there to help guide and shape my outreach to the Mormon Community. His mentorship has provided me with opportunities to teach and has taught me how to train others about how to witness to Mormons.

The goal of Concerned Christians has always been three things: first, to teach the Christian Community about the different Christ that the Mormons worship; second, to support Mormons coming out of Mormonism and help them develop a saving relationship with Christ; third, to train new Christian Missionaries about how to witness to Mormons. Jim has embodied these core beliefs in his interactions with me in my life and in the Christian community.

The Future

In this new era of Concerned Christians, the need to fulfill the ministry of Concerned Christians has never been more necessary. As the world faces a recession, the Latter-Day Saints are making a push to increase their ranks. The organized welfare system of the Mormon Church is being used to attract

Top Five List of Mormonism's Greatest Offenses

Every once in a while I have to remind myself of the reason why I write critically about Mormonism. I have several Mormon neighbors whom I really appreciate their friendship and neighborliness. And others whose names are included in my personal e-mail address list. So, why “pick on” Mormons? Reality soon takes hold, and it quickly comes to mind what is most offensive to me about Mormonism: The teachings of the Mormon Church stray far from the truth of historic Christianity, yet they continue to give the illusion of being just another regular denomination. And its deceptive nature gives a false impression that goes largely undetected by new converts and cradle Mormons alike. Hence the reason for this “Top Five” list.

We should all try to memorize the following list and/or keep it handy for witnessing. For the most part, it is taken from the pamphlet, *“Who Are the Concerned Christians?”* compiled by Jim and Judy Robertson; however, I have arranged the order of appearance to coincide with what I personally feel to be the worst of the worst offense at the top:

Number 1. Mormons criticize the Bible, claiming the Bible is full of errors, mistranslations and missing books. Their 8th *Article of Faith* says:

We believe the Bible to be the word of God as far as it is translated correctly: we also believe the Book of Mormon to be the word of God.”

“With the loss of the gospel, the nations of the earth went into a moral eclipse called the Dark Ages. Apostasy was universal.” (*Doctrines of Salvation*, Vol. 3, pp. 268-326; *Mormon Doctrine* by Bruce R. McConkie, p. 44).

Marsha’s side note: If the Bible is discredited, then virtually everything in the way of absolute truth is lost, leaving no reliable source to call on for spiritual guidance.

Number 2. Mormons place Joseph Smith above Jesus Christ in authority, relegating Jesus to a minor position in the kingdom of God.

“Joseph Smith holds keys of this last dispensation, and is now engaged behind the veil in the great work of the last days. No man or woman in this dispensation will ever enter into the celestial kingdom of God without the consent of Joseph Smith...He reigns there as supreme a being in His sphere, capacity, and calling as God does in heaven...” (*Journal of Discourses*, Vol. 7, p. 289).

Marsha’s side note: This idea is so outlandish and totally foreign to Christian belief. This by itself ought to be enough

to alert anyone who is even the least bit educated in Biblical knowledge away from Mormonism. The problem is, people are not forewarned about Joseph Smith BEFORE converting to Mormonism.

Number 3. Mormons believe Christ’s blood is not sufficient to cleanse all sin.

“Man may commit certain grievous sins – according to his light and knowledge – that will place him beyond the reach of the atoning blood of Christ.” (*Mormon Doctrine*, by Bruce R. McConkie, p. 93; *Doctrine of Salvation*, by Joseph F. Smith, Vol. 1, p. 135).

Marsha’s side note: The Bible is clear regarding anyone who comes to genuine belief in Christ, that even the worst of their sins can be forgiven (see 1 John 1:9). The only sin that will NOT be forgiven is that of unbelief (see Mark 3:29). This leads us to item number four below, almost seeming to contradict item number three...

Number 4. Mormons minimize sin and its consequences.

“Some degree of salvation will come to all who have not forfeited their right to it;...” (*The Articles of Faith*, by James E. Talmage, pp. 91 & 92).

Marsha’s side note: I remember Jim Robertson once told me Mormons believe that the few people who will NOT be going to heaven at all will be those such as himself, who are labeled “apostates” (because he and Judy left the Mormon church and joined a Christian church). So, I suppose Adolph Hitler and the like are off the hook? What nonsense.

Number 5. Mormons believe in works to conform to standards of personal righteousness.

“...for we know it is by grace that we are saved, after all we can do.” [Underline added]. 2 Nephi 25:23; *Articles of Faith*, p. 91-92; *Doctrine and Covenants* 76:52; *Mormon Doctrine*, p. 339).

Marsha’s side note: Grace alone is the vehicle by which we are saved, through faith—not of ourselves, and not by our own good deeds (see Ephesians 2: 8-9).

And there are many, many more examples of great offenses taught and practiced by the Mormon church which are a huge insult to Christianity, to say the least. Again, keep this newsletter handy for when the opportunity presents itself to be salt and light in a world where a lie can travel halfway around the world before truth even has the chance to “put its boots on,” as the saying goes.
